Donald Grable, a 62B classmate in the 3rd Squadron, passed away on 1 April this year. While none of us in the Thundering Third can recall interfacing with Don after graduation and subsequent schooling at Keesler AFB, we remember him as a quiet, focused OC who had a positive attitude toward the Air Force career ahead. Sadly, we are advised by his son, Keith, and daughter-in-law, Keya, that Don died alone at his home in Kettering, Ohio, and that there was no service or memorial following his death as his family had no immediate knowledge of his passing. **IN MEMORIAM – COL. THOMAS CRAWFORD, USAF (RET.)
OCS CLASS 62-B**

Thomas “Tom” Crawford was born in New York City, NY to James and Sheila Crawford on November 3, 1934 and passed away September 24, 2014 in Sacramento, CA.

Due to Tom's laser focused work ethic, his accomplishments were many. After receiving two master's degrees Tom decided to attend law school for two years at McGeorge School of Law. Tom enlisted in the United States Air Force in February of 1953. In 1961 he was selected for Officer Candidate School at Lackland Air Force Base, Texas. He flew as a navigator on EB-66s at Tahkli Air Base, Thailand, until 1967 flying 102 combat missions. In May 1968 he was assigned to the AFPRO General Dynamics Plant at Fort Worth, Texas as an F-111 series acceptance Weapons Systems Officer. In 1985 Tom was a part of the Air Attaché in Lima, Peru and also the Defense Attaché from 1986-1988. As a Master Navigator, Tom had over 3,000 hours of flying time. His military decorations and awards include the Distinguished Flying Cross, Meritorious Service Medal with two oak leaf clusters, Air Medal with nine oak leaf clusters, Air Force Commendation Medal and two Good Conduct Medals. He was promoted to Colonel in June 1982 with date of rank of 24 December 1981.

Tom also enjoyed spending time volunteering at several organizations including the RCIA at St. Mary's Church, the cardiology clinic at Mather VA Hospital and the supervisory committee for Mather Credit Union. Among his secular accomplishments, his most favored would be that of his family. Tom is survived by his devoted wife of 58 years, June; his six children; twelve grandchildren and a great granddaughter.

**IN MEMORIAM – COL. REYNOLD J. “TOM” THOMPSON, USAF (RET.)
OCS CLASS 63-B**

Reynold J. "Tom" Thompson, 74, of Plant City, Florida, entered into eternal rest on October 14, 2012. He was a Veteran of the United States Air Force having retired as a Colonel after 30 years of service and a contractor for the defense industry as the USAF Facility Manager for the Korean Combat Ops Intel Center (KCOIC) at Osan AB.

His distinguished military career began when he enlisted in September 1956 and served as Personnel Specialist at Tachikawa AB, Japan and Travis AFB, CA until 1962. At this time he was selected for OCS at Lackland AFB, TX. Following Data Processing School at Sheppard AFB, TX, he was assigned to Moody AFB, GA as Base Data Processing Officer, after which he attended Squadron Officer School and was later selected as Wing Outstanding Junior Officer for 1966. After a tour in the Office of Aerospace Research (OAR) in Arlington, VA., he attended Armed Forces Staff College in Norfolk, VA, then on to USEUCOM, in Stuttgart, Germany. After serving as Wing Comptroller at KI Sawyer AFB, MI, he went to HQ, PACAF, (Hawaii) and as a newly selected O-6, he became the PACAF Automatic Data Processing (ADP) Single Manager. June 1982 found him at Yokota AB, Japan as Comptroller, then Vice Wing Commander. This was followed by a two-year stint as Base Commander at Osan AB, ROK beginning in 1984. (SPECIAL NOTE – He spent his last year at Osan working for Wing Commander Colonel Chuck Link who graduated OCS Class 63-D and is now retired MG Link.

He is survived by his wife of 22 years Grace H. Thompson; four children; and four grandchildren.

Interment with full military honors was at Arlington National Cemetery, Arlington, Virginia.

**IN MEMORIAM – MAJ. LAWRENCE COLEMAN “LARRY” DUVALL, USAF (RET.)
OCS CLASS 62-B**

Lawrence Coleman Duvall (Larry), 76, of Huntsville passed away on Saturday, April 26, 2014. Larry was a resident of Huntsville for the past 34 years. He was an active member of Whitesburg Baptist Church and Gideons International. Larry was born on 17 June, 1937 in Franklin County, Kentucky. After High School, Larry entered the US Air Force in 1955 and served in Southeast Asia from 1972-1973. He retired from the AF in 1975 and after completing college went to work for the US Army as a civil servant until 1999 and then retired with over 40 years of government service.

Larry is survived by his wife of 30 years, Greta Eslinger Allen Duvall; four children, nine grandchildren and seven great grandchildren.

OTS TOUR, MAXWELL AFB

Friday, 9 October

We will spend the day on Maxwell AFB visiting the USAF Officer Training School (OTS) with a lunch at the Maxwell Club. The mission of OTS is to produce motivated officers of character who embody the American warrior ethos and are culturally aware, expeditionary minded and prepared to lead. It is the flexible commissioning program for the AF because it has the capability to quickly increase or decrease annual officer production. The school staff consists of more than 150 full-time active duty, AFRes and ANG members. OTS is a Group level command with three squadrons and one ANG Detachment. Its programs consist of Basic Officer Training (BOT) for college graduates to be commissioned 2Lts, Commissioned Officer Training (COT) for health professionals, judge advocates and chaplains who have received direct commissions to 2Lt thru Lt Col. OTS also hosts AF Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) cadets during their summer Field Training encampments. The school has two academic buildings, four dormitories, a dining facility, physical conditioning center, parade field and track and sports fields. Additionally, it maintains an AEF training garrison, a 200 acre field training area, a high ropes course, confidence course and two expeditionary assault courses.

ENLISTED RESEARCH CENTER MUSEUM, GUNTER ANNEX and RIVER CRUISE LUNCH

Saturday, 10 October

The USAF Enlisted Heritage Research Institute on Maxwell-Gunter AFB has a small but excellent museum which covers a myriad of enlisted personnel career fields and their contributions to the success of the world's premier Air Force. At the entrance, a display features an interactive, animated Airman. The surrounding grounds have many memorial stones and equipment displays. After touring this unique museum area, we will return to downtown Montgomery's riverside for a one hour narrated lunch cruise on the Harriott II Riverboat. You will travel back in time to days of the historic paddle-wheel boats meandering along the scenic Alabama River.
