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AF MUSEUM PLAQUE PROJECT – A plaque commemorating the Air Force Officer Candidate School was put on display on 1 September, 2010, at the National Museum of the United States Air Force. The plaque is mounted on Memorial Wall number two in the Museum’s Memorial Park. This joins three other displays elsewhere in the park which commemorate individual classes (54B, 58A and 63C).



The plaque, which was designed and purchased by the 63rd Officer Candidate Wing Association, was manufactured by Dodds Monument Company, a company which started business in Xenia, Ohio, in 1864. It will be officially dedicated during our 2011 Reunion.

If you happen to be visiting the Museum, or their web site, and want to see the plaque, it and the other OCS displays are listed under Pilot/Cadet Classes. I am attempting to get that changed to either add OCS to the heading or give us a heading of our own. A map to help you locate the plaque is available at the information desk in the lobby of the Museum. The map can also be found on the Museum website.



2011 REUNION, DAYTON, OHIO – The overall planning factors for this next reunion were to keep it short, sweet and inexpensive, with the current economic situation being one of the major factors. The Monday and Thursday travel days are generally the least expensive for airline tickets. The Hope Hotel room rates are the lowest in the area, but the facilities are excellent and fully meet our needs. The hotel will provide a sizeable hospitality room that we can stock on our own, and also has a full service restaurant open 6AM–10PM. The reunion length will be three days, instead of our normal four, which saves a hotel night, and we will be running the reunion with our own volunteers. Finally, we will be offering only three optional events. As usual, these optional events will depend on sufficient sign-ups to cover the transportation costs. In the case of the Golf Tournament, it may require the golfers to arrive one day early, depending on the tee times we can arrange with Wright-Patterson AFB Golf Course. The Carillon Historic Park tour showcases Dayton’s rich heritage of creativity, invention and milestones that changed the Nation and the World, involving 25 major exhibits including the Wright Flyer III, automobiles, train cars, bicycles, cash registers and a 1930’s print shop. For those who have recently visited the AF Museum, or prefer another venue after the Memorial Plaque dedication ceremony, we are negotiating a possible lunchtime matinee performance at the La Comedia Dinner Theater. With all this in mind we are hoping to hold the individual registration cost to around \$75–80 dollars. The tentative schedule of events is as follows:

Sunday, 11 Sep	Golfers arrive and register. Golfers meeting in Hospitality Room
Monday, 12 Sep	Golf Tournament, Registration, Hospitality Room and Welcome Reception
Tuesday, 13 Sep	Business Meeting/Elections, Class Meetings, Carillon Park with Dinner, Hospitality Room
Wednesday, 14 Sep	Dedication Ceremony, AF Museum or Lunch Theater, Farewell Reception and Banquet, Hospitality Room
Thursday, 15 Sep	Farewell Breakfast on your own in restaurant and departures

Shortly after the beginning of 2011 we will be sending out registration forms, which will include the specific details and costs for the optional events and banquet meal options.

LACKLAND MUSEUM UPDATE –The renovated Museum officially re-opened on 12 August and is now called the USAF Airman Heritage Museum. Using interactive technology and museum quality lighting, it now consists of 31 exhibits, one of which depicts the OCS program from 1942–1963. The initial exhibit is fairly basic, but we hope to make some upgrades by providing ideas and materials to further improve its content and appearance. Finally, in addition to the majority of museum visitors being families of Basic Military Training (BMT) graduates, it will be used for an enhanced educational program utilizing guided lectures on AF history and heritage during week 7 of BMT.
